You must be:

- A citizen of the United States.
- A legal resident of Washington.
- At least 18 years old by Election Day.
- Not under the authority of the Department of Corrections.

Registration deadline:

In person deadline (new Washington voters only) is February 5, 2018.

Replacement Educational Programs and Operations Levy

Ballot Title

The Board of Directors of Franklin Pierce School District No. 402 adopted Resolution No. 17-R-10 concerning a proposition to replace an expiring levy for education. If approved, Proposition No. 1 will authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, replacing an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District for educational programs and operations expenses not funded by the State:

all as provided in Resolution No. 17-R-10 and subject to legal limits on levy rates and amounts at the time of levy. Should Proposition No. 1 be approved?

Explanatory Statement

Passage of Proposition 1 would help Franklin Pierce School District fund educational programs and operations not funded by the State, including, but not limited to: classroom teachers; safety personnel; health services, librarians and counselors; student transportation (staff and fuel costs); programs for special needs students, such as gifted, remedial and disabled; textbooks, classroom supplies and library materials; music; art and athletic programs; and other educational programs and operations expenses. Taxes collected by the proposed levy will provide approximately 18% of the District's General Fund budget.

The proposed four-year levy will replace the District's current levy approved by the voters in 2014 that expires at the end of 2018. Passage of this proposition would authorize the collection of taxes to provide \$19,000,000 in 2019; \$20,000,000 in 2020; \$21,000,000 in 2021; and \$22,000,000 in 2022. The tax levy rates required to produce these levy amounts are estimated to be \$4.71 per \$1,000 of assessed value in 2019, \$4.31 in 2020, \$3.93 in 2021 and \$3.58 in 2022.

Exemptions from taxes may be available to homeowners who are 61 or older, or disabled, and who meet certain income requirements. To determine if you qualify, call the Pierce County Assessor at 253.798.2169.

Approve – Teachers, Small Classes, Books, Arts, and Athletics

Prop. 1 funds teachers, small classes, textbooks, programs for both high-achieving and struggling students, health services, counselors, transportation, special education, arts, music, athletics, maintenance of healthy & safe schools, playgrounds, playfields, safety/security systems, emergency preparedness, and more.

Replacement Levy for Instructional Technology Improvements

Ballot Title

The Board of Directors of Franklin Pierce School District No. 402 adopted Resolution No. 17-R-11 concerning a proposition to replace an expiring levy for instructional technology. If approved, Proposition No. 2 will authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, replacing an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District to continue funding the acquisition, installation and modernization of instructional technology equipment, infrastructure, systems and facilities to enhance student learning:

all as provided in Resolution No. 17-R-11. Should Proposition No. 2 be approved?

Explanatory Statement

Passage of Proposition 2 would help Franklin Pierce School District acquire, install and modernize instructional technology equipment, infrastructure, systems and facilities and make other improvements and upgrades to the District's instructional technology systems and facilities, all to enhance student learning. The proposed levy would significantly increase the number of technology resources available to students and staff, continuing the District's commitment to provide equity in technology accessibility for all students by funding much needed growth in network infrastructure, server and storage resources, continued maintenance, equipment replacement cycles, and data resources.

The proposed four-year levy will replace the District's current levy approved by the voters in 2014 that expires at the end of 2018. The proposed four year capital levy would authorize the collection of taxes to provide \$1,777,000 in 2019; \$2,043,000 in 2020; \$2,350,000 in 2021; and \$2,700,000 in 2022. The tax levy rate required to produce these levy amounts is estimated to be \$0.44 per \$1,000 of assessed value in all four years of collection.

Exemptions from taxes may be available to homeowners who are 61 or older, or disabled, and who meet certain income requirements. To determine if you qualify, call the Pierce County Assessor at 253.798.2169.
