O'Malley announced that Representative Mitchell had been delayed in her arrival at the meeting, and asked that Proposal R2002-48 be deferred until Mitchell arrives.

VIII. ORDINANCES

PROPOSAL NO. 2001-62s, AN ORDINANCE OF THE PIERCE COUNTY COUNCIL AMENDING CHAPTER 19D.160 OF THE PIERCE COUNTY CODE, "COMPREHENSIVE PARK AND RECREATION PLAN", BY REPEALING THE COMPREHENSIVE PARK, RECREATION, AND OPEN SPACE PLAN FOR THE GIG HARBOR/KEY PENINSULA; AND SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

O'Malley moved that the Proposal be continued to May 21, 2002; motion seconded and passed.

Staff Testimony

Jennifer Andres, Public Works and Utilities Department, introduced Les Olsen, a County employee who will be sharing Andres' duties on right-of-way issues. Andres stated this Ordinance represents the vacation of five feet on each side of this right-of-way, which is currently 70 feet. This vacation would reduce the right-of-way to 60 feet. She stated the Department supports the request.

The Chair called for public testimony; there was no response.
The Proposal passed on a roll call vote of seven to zero.

Public Testimony

Charlotte Chalker, Principal Petitioner, stated the Ordinance
indicates the right-of-way in question is in the Spanaway
area. She stated it is in the Parkland area.

Wimsett moved to delete the reference to Spanaway in the
Ordinance, and correct it to Parkland; motion seconded and
passed.

Staff Testimony

Andres stated the vacation request represents 10 feet of
right-of-way. She stated the request has been heard in
Committee, and received a do pass recommendation.

The Proposal passed as amended on a roll call vote of seven
to zero.

PROPOSAL NO. 2002-7, AN ORDINANCE OF THE PIERCE COUNTY COUNCIL PROHIBITING THE DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS WITHIN UNINCORPORATED PORTIONS OF PIERCE COUNTY IN THE SPANAWAY, GRAHAM, PUYALLUP, AND SOUTH HILL AREAS. (TITLE SUMMARY: PLEASE SEE SECTION 2. OF THE ORDINANCE FOR COMPLETE LEGAL DESCRIPTION.)

O'Malley moved adoption; motion seconded. The Clerk read the title into the record.

Wimsett stated this Proposal has been continued from prior hearings, and he has been meeting with concerned individuals and representatives of the Sheriff's Department. He stated that some of these areas are located near schools, and there is a special concern at Rocky Ridge.

Staff Testimony

Rick Altoon, Sheriff's Department Mt. Detachment, stated there has been extreme growth in the areas represented in this Ordinance, and new homes and schools have been built. He stated there have been occasions when the Rocky Ridge School has had to be put into a lock-down mode because of shooting nearby the school. He recommended passage of the Ordinance.

The Chair called for public testimony; there was no response. The Proposal passed on a roll call vote of seven to zero.

PROPOSAL NO. 2002-8, AN ORDINANCE OF THE PIERCE COUNTY COUNCIL PROHIBITING THE DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS WITHIN UNINCORPORATED PORTIONS OF PIERCE COUNTY, IN THE BONNEY LAKE, SOUTH PRAIRIE, BUCKLEY, AND LAKE TAPPS AREAS. (TITLE SUMMARY: PLEASE SEE SECTION 2. OF THE ORDINANCE FOR LEGAL DESCRIPTION OF THE AREA.)

O'Malley moved adoption; motion seconded. The Clerk read the title into the record.

Shabro stated she had sponsored this Ordinance for the same reasons stated on the prior Ordinance, and there has been a great deal of growth in these areas. There is a concern that there are schools nearby, and it is not appropriate for shooting to occur in these areas.

The Chair called for public testimony; there was no response. The Proposal passed on a roll call vote of seven to zero.

PROPOSAL NO. 2002-16s, AN ORDINANCE OF THE PIERCE COUNTY COUNCIL CHANGING THE NAME OF A PORTION OF 69TH AVENUE EAST AND 70TH AVENUE EAST TO WOODLAND AVENUE EAST; DESIGNATING THE ARTERIAL CLASSIFICATION FOR THIS ROAD BY AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 98-117; REVISING THE MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT FOR THIS ROAD BY AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2001-103; DIRECTING THE COUNTY ENGINEER TO PROPERLY IMPLEMENT THE ARTERIAL DESIGNATION, MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT, AND ROAD NAME THROUGH THE USE OF APPROPRIATE TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES; AND SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

O'Malley moved adoption; motion seconded. The Clerk read the title into the record.

Staff Testimony

Tom Ballard, Public Works and Utilities Department, stated the Department is requesting the renaming of portions of 69th Avenue East and 70th Avenue East to Woodland, and setting the speed limit at 30 miles per hour. This will provide for continuity in the name of the street.

Goings thanked Ballard and the affected residents for their work on this request.

O'Malley moved adoption of Council Amendment No. 1 as set forth in Attachment II to these minutes; motion seconded and passed.

The Chair called for public testimony; there was no response. The Proposal passed as amended on a roll call vote of seven to zero.

PROPOSAL NO. 2002-18s, AN ORDINANCE OF THE PIERCE COUNTY COUNCIL FINDING THE PROPOSED NON-EXCLUSIVE FRANCHISE AND LEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN PIERCE COUNTY AND SPRINT SPECTRUM, L. P., FOR WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATIONS ANTENNAE AND EQUIPMENT TO BE PLACED ON PROPERTY OWNED BY PIERCE COUNTY, WHICH IS LOCATED AT 215 SOUTH 36TH STREET, TACOMA, WASHINGTON, AND KNOWN AS THE PUGET SOUND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH BUILDING, TO BE IN THE PUBLIC INTEREST; SETTING FORTH TERMS AND CONDITIONS ACCOMPANYING THE GRANTING OF THE FRANCHISE; PROVIDING FOR THE STANDARDS, CONDITIONS, RENTAL AMOUNT, AND OTHER TERMS OF SUCH OCCUPANCY; PRESCRIBING REMEDIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS THEREOF; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE TO ENTER INTO THE FRANCHISE AND LEASE AGREEMENT.

O'Malley moved adoption; motion seconded. The Clerk read the title into the record.

Staff Testimony

Skip Stansbury, Executive's Office, provided an overview of the Ordinance authorizing the franchise for the placement of telecommunications antennae and equipment on the roof of the Puget Sound Behavior Health Building. Stansbury responded to questions of Councilmembers regarding specifics of the agreement such as what happens in the event the roof needs repairs, and the amount being charged for the franchise.

The Chair called for public testimony; there was no response. The Proposal passed on roll call vote of seven to zero.

PROPOSAL NO. 2002-19s, AN ORDINANCE OF THE PIERCE COUNTY COUNCIL AMENDING SECTIONS 5.24.050 AND 6.04.030 OF THE PIERCE COUNTY CODE RELATIVE TO FEES FOR KENNELS, CATTERIES, GROOMING PARLORS, PET SHOPS, AND PET LICENSES; ADDING A BI-ANNUAL FINANCIAL, REQUEST FOR SERVICE AND PERMIT DATA REPORTING REQUIREMENT; AND SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

O'Malley moved adoption; motion seconded. The Clerk read the title into the record.

Staff Testimony

In response to the Chair's request, Weber provided an explanation of the distinction between a boarding kennel and breeder or a commercial kennel. He stated this amendment was drafted in response to letters that had been received since the Committee hearing on this issue.

Steve Pierce, Director of The Humane Society for Tacoma and Pierce County, stated these fee adjustments are being requested to address the over \$500,000 shortfall the Society is facing. He stated this will assist in providing sufficient funding for animal control and enforcement services in the unincorporated areas.

The Chair asked the Clerk to read Council Amendment No. 1 into the record.

Pierce responded to questions of Councilmembers regarding how the money would be spent, how the amounts of the fees were determined, and how many licensed businesses would be affected by this Ordinance in the County.

Following Councilmembers discussion of the amendment, it passed on a voice vote.

Pat Kenney, Budget and Finance Department, responded to

questions about the revenue that would be generated from this fee increase, stating it is anticipated \$42,000 would be realized for the remainder of this year, and approximately \$166,000 for a full year.

O'Malley pointed out the Humane Society needs to find a better way of tracking all businesses to make sure that all are licensed, to equitably spread the costs of operation.

Public Testimony

Steve Cheney stated the \$500 fee is excessive, and it would have to be passed on to customers, most of whom are retired and would not be able to afford the increase. A copy of his letter is contained in the Ordinance file.

Lee Atwood submitted a written statement; a copy is contained in the Ordinance file, in opposition to the Ordinance.

Elizabeth Thompson submitted a written statement. A copy is contained in the Ordinance file expressing opposition to the Ordinance, and asking that the licenses be extended to doggy day cares and veterinarians who are in competition with boarders.

William Russell stated he had submitted a letter. A copy of his letter in opposition is contained in the Ordinance file.

Ed Tyte spoke in opposition to the Ordinance, stating he has a concern that there are many stray dogs in the County that are not licensed that the Humane Society is not enforcing.

Harry Hicks referenced a letter from the American Kennel Club. A copy is contained in the Ordinance file.

Theresa Miller spoke in opposition to the Ordinance, stating she feels the amount of increase is out of line.

Shirley Arnold spoke in opposition to the \$500 fee.

Beverly Lapointe stated she feels the \$500 license is excessive.

In response to Brown's question regarding senior citizen discounts, Pierce stated it is possible that an amendment could be drafted to provide a senior citizen discount on license fees, as is done for animal license fees.

Tom Young stated he feels the County needs to be regulating the non-licensed businesses, and collect the license fee on a fair and equitable basis.

Louise Peterson spoke in opposition to the Ordinance.

Pat Toy does not feel there is justification for an increase to \$500.

Ernest Dallas stated the Humane Society is not doing their job, and feels they should be putting more emphasis on licensing dogs and businesses.

Angie Harris spoke in opposition to the Ordinance, stating that all dogs should be licensed, and the Humane Society should be enforcing that.

Jan Schreiber stated volunteers could assist the Humane Society in identifying businesses that should be licensed.

John Helmuth stated the Humane Society could generate more revenue by licensing all dogs and businesses.

Moss moved an amendment on page 1 of Exhibit "A" to change the license fee for a commercial kennel or cattery, foster shelter/kennel/cattery, and hobby kennel from \$500 to \$150; motion seconded. Following a discussion, the amendment was withdrawn.

Wimsett moved that the entire matter be re-referred to the Rules and Operations Committee for further review; motion seconded and passed.

PROPOSAL NO. 2002-30, AN ORDINANCE OF THE PIERCE COUNTY COUNCIL REPEALING CHAPTER 19D.160 OF THE PIERCE COUNTY CODE, COMPREHENSIVE PARK AND RECREATION PLAN; ADOPTING A NEW CHAPTER 19D.160, PARK, RECREATION, AND OPEN SPACE PLAN; SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND ADOPTING FINDINGS OF FACT.

O'Malley moved that the Proposal be continued to May 21, 2002; motion seconded and passed.

1. O'Malley acknowledged the fact that Councilmember Biskey has been appointed as Chair of the Puget Sound Regional Council, and commended her for serving in this position.

XI. GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENTS
