The District No. 5 meeting of the Pierce County Council was called to order at 5:35 p.m. by Acting Chair Goings.

Goings moved approval of the Consent Agenda; motion seconded and passed on a roll call vote of six to zero.

Tim Stensager, Assistant Superintendent, Franklin Pierce School District, welcomed the Council to Collins Elementary School.

Gelman introduced the Council staff in attendance.

Gelman reminded the audience that Resolution No. R2007-63 recently adopted by the Council in honor of the 100th Anniversary of Collins Elementary School. Goings read a portion of the Proclamation into the record.

Muri acknowledged the rising number of homeowners in Pierce County.

The Proposal was adopted on a roll call vote of six to zero.

Goings moved adoption; motion seconded. The Clerk read the title into the record.

Farrell spoke in support of the reappointment.

The Chair called for public testimony and final Council remarks; there was no response. The Proposal was adopted on a roll call vote of six to zero.

Proposal No. R2007-80, A Resolution of the Pierce County Council Confirming the Reappointment of Two Existing Members (James Downs and Patricia Drake) to the South Hill Advisory Commission.

Goings moved adoption; motion seconded. The Clerk read the title into the record.

The Chair called for public testimony and final Council remarks; there was no response. The Proposal was adopted on a roll call vote of six to zero.

VIII. Ordinances

Proposal No. 2007-22, An Ordinance of the Pierce County Council Repealing Resolution No. 7486 Which Prohibits the Discharge of Firearms in the La Grande Vicinity.

Goings moved adoption; motion seconded. The Clerk read the title into the record.

Staff Testimony

Long reported the Proposal received a do pass recommendation by the Public Safety and Human Services Committee on May 8, 2007. Long provided background information on the Proposal.

Long suggested oral amendments to page 1 of 3 of the Proposal: at line 31 delete the blank "_____" and replace it with the date "May 8", at line 33 delete the blank "_____" and replace it with the word "pass", and at line 35 delete the blank "_____" and replace it with the date "June 26".

Goings moved the oral amendments suggested by Long; motion seconded and passed.

Clerk Note: As a clerical correction the words "Resolution No. 7486" were deleted at line 33 and replaced with the words "Ordinance No. 2007-22". (This was not part of the motion.)

The Chair called for testimony on the amendments; there was no response. The motion carried.

Public Testimony on the Proposal as Amended

Alan Hodges, Pierce County Firearms Advisory Commission, explained the Firearms Advisory Commission's recommendation to repeal Resolution No. 7486.

The Proposal passed as amended on a roll call vote of six to zero.

Proposal No. 2007-25, An Ordinance of the Pierce County Council Repealing Ordinance No. 96-86 Which Prohibited the Discharge of Firearms in the Wilkeson Area; and Creating Two Areas Where the Discharge of Firearms Would be Prohibited in Unincorporated Portions of Sections 22, 26, 27, 28, and 33 of Township 19 North, Range 6 East, in the Wilkeson Area.

Goings moved adoption; motion seconded. The Clerk read the title into the record.

Staff Testimony

Long reported the Proposal received a do pass recommendation by the Public Safety and Human Services Committee on May 8, 2007. Long explained the Firearms Advisory Commission recommended to split the current area into two areas.

Farrell moved the Proposal not be approved and moved that the Proposal be postpone indefinitely; Goings seconded the motion for discussion purposes.

Hodges explained the existing Proposal file was reviewed to obtain existing parcel owners and to review the source documents.

To allow for public testimony on the Proposal, Farrell withdrew his motion.

Public Testimony

The following testified on the Proposal: Margaret Chewen, Rebecca Gilbert, and Buzz Grant.

As part of Council discussion regarding the notification process to affected residents, Bunney suggested the Proposal be re-referred to committee; Muri concurred.

Goings spoke to the number of calls received by the Sheriff regarding the no-shooting zone, and recommended in the future data from LESA Records be part of the Proposal record.

Goings moved that the Proposal be postponed indefinitely and that the Firearms Advisory Commission review the Proposal again; motion seconded and carried.

Proposal No. 2007-32, An Ordinance of the Pierce County Council Amending Chapter 14.08 of the Pierce County Code, "Park Code".

Goings moved adoption; motion seconded. The Clerk read the title into the record.

Staff Testimony

Long reported the Proposal received a do pass recommendation by the Public Safety and Human Services Committee on May 8, 2007.

Gerald Lawrence, Sheriff's Department, explained the reason for the proposed changes to the Park Code. Lawrence suggested the following oral amendments to Exhibit A: page 1 of 4 at line 16 after the word "scooter," insert "or any other unlicensed motorized vehicle"; page 3 at line 11 after the word "at" delete the words "Lake Tapps County Park" and insert the words "any park"; page 3 at lines 15-16 after the word "any" delete "Pierce County" and insert the word "park", after the word "owned" insert the words "or operated", after the words "except with permission of the" replace the word "Executive" with the word "Director"; page 3 at line 17 after the word "at" delete the words "Lake Tapps County Park" and insert the words "any park unless designated for that purpose".

Bunney moved to accept the oral amendments suggested by Lawrence; motion seconded.

Councilmembers Bush and Goings expressed their concerns with the suggested amendments.

Public Testimony on the amendments

Dave Morrell, former Parks Advisory Board Member, testified on the amendments.

The motion carried.

The Chair called for public testimony on the Proposal as amended; there was no response. The Proposal passed as amended on a roll call vote of six to zero.

Proposal No. 2007-33, An Ordinance of the Pierce County Council Amending the Pierce County Code, Section 1.16.120, "Monetary Penalties – Restitution".

Goings moved adoption; motion seconded. The Clerk read the title into the record.

Staff Testimony

Long reported the Proposal received a do pass recommendation by the Public Safety and Human Services Committee on May 8, 2007, and explained the Proposal brings the civil penalty amount up to the State amount. Long explained the proposal amendments would

make the infractions amount equal between the time this Proposal was introduced and today's final hearing.

Goings moved Council Amendment 1 on salmon; motion seconded. A copy of the amendment is identified as Attachment I to these minutes.

The Chair called for public testimony on the amendment; there was no response. The motion carried.

Public Testimony on the Proposal as Amended

Robert Hill testified on the amended Proposal.

The Chair called for final Council remarks; there was no response. The Proposal passed as amended on a roll call vote of six to zero.

Proposal No. 2007-39, An Ordinance of the Pierce County Council Amending Ordinance No. 99-82s by Removing the Prohibition Against the Discharge of Firearms on Approximately 752 Acres East of the Town of Eatonville.

Goings moved adoption; motion seconded. The Clerk read the title into the record.

Long reported the Proposal received a do pass recommendation by the Public Safety and Human Services Committee on May 8, 2007. Long provided background information on the Proposal and the Advisory Commission's recommendations.

The Chair called for public testimony and final Council remarks; there was no response. The Proposal passed on a roll call vote of six to zero.

Proposal No. 2007-42, An Ordinance of the Pierce County Council Amending the Pierce County Salary Classification Plan Regarding the Pierce County Auditor, Assessor-Treasurer, and Sheriff Salaries and Cost of Living Adjustments.

Goings moved adoption; motion seconded. The Clerk read the title into the record.

Robert Hill testified on the Proposal.

Staff Testimony

Bocchi reported the Proposal received a do pass recommendation by the Rules and Operations Committee on June 4, 2007. Bocchi summarized the Proposal to the Council and noted the salary history is included in the Proposal.

Farrell moved to continue the Proposal to the next Council meeting; motion seconded. The motion failed on a roll call vote of three to three.

The question was called. The Proposal passed on a roll call vote of four to two; Goings and Muri voted nay.

SUBJECT: **PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO ORDINANCE NO. 2007-33**

Between the time this ordinance was introduced and this final hearing, the State again increased numerous state civil penalties. Sgt. Jerry Lawrence of the Sheriff's Department has asked the Council to consider amending Proposal No. 2007-33 to further adjust the County penalties to make them comparable to state penalties.

In order to retain an equal relative increase in each class of violation, his recommendations for the amended penalty amounts are:

1. On page 1 of 1, of Exhibit A, line 12, strike ~~\$500.00~~ and insert **600**.
2. On page 1 of 1, of Exhibit A, line 14, strike ~~\$250.00~~ and insert **300**.
3. On page 1 of 1, of Exhibit A, line 16, strike ~~\$100.00~~ and insert **120**.
4. On page 1 of 1, of Exhibit A, line 18, strike ~~\$50.00~~ and insert **60**

This retains the same percentage of difference between each class as well as increases each the same percentage amount.
