

How to Register to Vote

You must be a citizen of the United States; at least 18 years of age by the date of the next election; a resident of Pierce County; and not presently denied your civil rights as a result of a felony conviction. You may obtain a form online at vote.wa.gov, register at the Pierce County Elections Department, 2401 S 35th St, Rm 200, Tacoma, or a form can be mailed to you by calling (253) 798-VOTE (8683) or 1-800-446-4979. If you register by mail, your application must be postmarked at least 30 days prior to an election to vote. If you are a new registrant in Washington State, you may register to vote in person at the Elections Department no less than 15 days prior to the election.

Address or Name Change

If you move, be sure to notify the Auditor's Office of your new address, either by using the online address change form - piercecountywa.org/auditor or call (253) 798-VOTE (8683). If your name has changed, you will need to submit a new registration form to update your signature.

Cancellation of Registration

You will only be removed from the registration files if you fill out a cancellation card or register to vote in another county or state. If a voter is deceased, another voter may fill out a card to cancel his or her registration.

First class postage rates increase to 41¢ on May 14, 2007. Mail your ballot early to avoid the increase, or use one of our Vote By Mail Express Booths.

If you want to vote by mail permanently, please fill out this form and send it in. If you already receive your ballot by mail for every election, you do not need to fill this out.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION
GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS - \$259,500,000



Official Ballot Title:

The Board of Directors of Puyallup School District No. 3 adopted Resolution No. 85 2006-07 concerning a proposition to finance capital improvements to its facilities district wide. This proposition would authorize the replacement of Firgrove, Northwood and Spinning Elementary Schools; building an additional elementary school; expanding Emerald Ridge and Puyallup High Schools; upgrading Ferrucci Jr. High, Sunrise, Wildwood, and Hunt Elementary Schools; improving Sparks Stadium; constructing other capital improvements, including safety and technology district wide; issuing general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years in the amount of \$259,500,000; and levying annual excess property taxes to pay such bonds, as provided in Resolution No. 85 2006-07.

Should Proposition No. 1 be approved or rejected?

Statement For:

Successful students and strong communities need excellent schools. Support this bond measure to ensure excellent schools in Puyallup.

Puyallup District continues to grow by 300 students per year, enough for a new school every two years. At the same time, existing schools need critical repairs and renovations.
