Carbonado Historical School District No. 19 360-829-0121	Resolution No. 03-08, Proposition No. 1, if approved, would authorize the District to levy excess taxes for educational technology improvements. Collection years: 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015. Approximate levy rate: \$.11 per \$1,000 of assessed value to collect \$12,000 each year.	Simple Majority
Auburn School District No. 408 253-931-4930 (Crosses into King County)	Resolution No. 1102, Proposition No. 1, if approved, would authorize the District to issue general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years for \$239,000,000, to plan, construct and equip the replacements of Auburn High School, Olympic Middle School and Terminal Park Elementary School and make other capital improvements. *Includes King County validation	12,349 TOTAL votes plus a 60% favorable margin*
