

# THE PIERCE COUNTY VOTERS' BILL OF RIGHTS

You Have The Right To:

1

Cast your ballot in a non-disruptive atmosphere free of interference.

2

Vote if you are in line by 8 p.m.

3

Vote by provisional ballot if your name does not appear in the poll book.

4

Vote at your old polling place if you have moved within 30 days of the election.

5

Request assistance in voting, if needed.

6

Bring newspaper endorsements, sample ballots and voter's pamphlets into the voting booth.

7

Protect the secrecy of your ballot.

8

Receive a new ballot if you make a mistake or change your mind.

9

Screen your ballot after voting to ensure it is complete and correct.

10

Have your ballot counted fairly and impartially.

Lots of Americans don't bother to vote. They think it's difficult, time consuming, or they're afraid they can't figure out who to vote for.

Truth is, voting is an easy, rewarding experience. It takes but a minute or two to cast your ballot and you can put as much thought into the issues and candidates as you want.
