<b>Tacoma School District No. 10</b> <b>Proposition No. 2</b>  <b>253-571-1015</b>	<b>School Facility Improvements and Technology Upgrades Levy</b> Permits the District to renovate or replace three schools and, district-wide, address health, safety, and security upgrades, energy-efficient heating/lighting, roofs, electrical, plumbing, playground/playfield and technology improvements by authorizing the levy of excess taxes.  \$15,950,000 for collection in 2011, \$17,910,000 in 2012, \$20,660,000 in 2013, \$27,410,000 in 2014, \$30,210,000 in 2015, and \$28,260,000 in 2016. <b>Fife School District No. 417*</b> <b>Proposition No. 2</b>  <b>253-517-1000</b>	<b>Capital Projects Technology Levy</b> Authorizes the District to levy the following excess taxes to fund educational technology, equipment and training, including classroom computers and technology facilities.  \$900,000 for collection each year in 2011-2014. <b>Pierce County Fire Protection District No. 8</b> <b>Proposition No. 1</b>  <b>253-927-2313</b>	<b>Merger of Fire Protection Districts</b> Merges Pierce County Fire Protection District 8 into District 22, creating one fire protection district under the name of Pierce County Fire Protection District No. 22. <b>Pierce County Fire Protection District No. 10</b> <b>Proposition No. 1</b>  <b>253-922-0594</b>	<b>Medic One - Emergency Medical Services Property Tax Levy</b> Authorizes the District to impose regular emergency medical services property tax levies of \$.50 or less per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for each of six consecutive years beginning in 2011.	388 Yes Votes Plus a 60% Favorable Margin
<b>King County Rural Library District*</b> <b>Proposition No. 1</b>  <b>425-369-9275</b>	Authorizes the District to restore regular property tax levy rate to \$0.50 per thousand dollars of assessed value for collection in 2011, and to increase the levy in each year thereafter as allowed by chapter 84.55 RCW. (Levy Lid Lift)	Simple Majority
