If approved, Proposed Charter Amendment No. 1 would: (a) move the election of Councilmembers and the Executive to odd-numbered years by 2015; and (b) increase term limits for Councilmembers and the Executive from two consecutive four-year terms to three consecutive four-year terms, consistent with term limits in effect for Auditor, Assessor-Treasurer and Sheriff, all as set forth in Ordinance No. 2008-113. If approved, Proposed Charter Amendment No. 3 would eliminate Instant Runoff Voting (also known in Pierce County as "Ranked Choice Voting" or "RCV") and restore the primary and general election system for all county elective offices in accordance with state general election law; all as set forth in Ordinance No. 2009-1. Referendum Measure No. 71 Passed by the Legislature and Ordered Referred by Petition The legislature passed Engrossed Second Substitute Senate Bill 5688 concerning rights and responsibilities of state-registered domestic partners and voters have filed a sufficient referendum petition on this bill. This bill would expand the rights, responsibilities, and obligations accorded state-registered same-sex and senior domestic partners to be equivalent to those of married spouses, except that a domestic partnership is not a marriage. 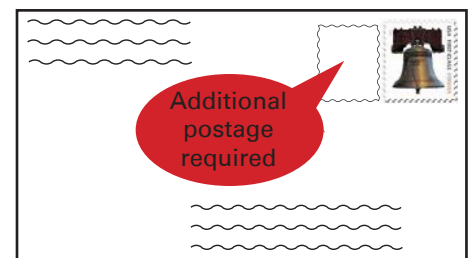

How to mark your Ranked Choice Voting Ballot

On your Ranked Choice Voting Ballot you will vote for Pierce County Auditor only.

Ranked Choice Voting Ballot

You may rank up to three choices. Vote across in each race. Use a pencil or blue pen to connect the arrow. Do not use red ink.

- ➔ Mark your first choice in Column 1.
- ➔ Mark your second choice in Column 2. This choice should be different from your first choice.
- ➔ Mark your third choice in Column 3. This choice should be different from your first and second choices.

You may rank less than three candidates. Leave remaining columns blank.

If you mark the same candidate in more than one column, your vote for that candidate will only count once.

- ➔ If you wish to mark only one choice instead of three, mark your single choice in Column 1 and leave Columns 2 and 3 blank. If you wish to mark only two choices, mark your first choice in Column 1, your second choice in Column 2 and leave Column 3 blank.
- ➔ Return both ballot cards. An estimated minimum postage of \$0.61 is required to return your ballot envelope by mail.

* Select only one candidate in each column. If you mark the same candidate in more than one column, your vote for that candidate will only count once.
