State of Washington	<b>Initiative Measure No. 1033</b> This measure would limit growth of certain state, county, and city revenue to annual inflation and population growth, not including voter-approved revenue increases. Revenue collected above the limit would reduce property	Simple Majority
State of Washington	<b>Referendum Measure No. 71</b> This bill would expand the rights, responsibilities, and obligations accorded state registered same-sex and senior domestic partners to be equivalent to those of married spouses, except that a domestic partnership is not a marriage. Pierce County (253) 798-7777	Ordinance No. 2008-113, <b>Charter Amendment No. 1</b> , if approved, would (a) move the election of Councilmember and the Executive to odd-numbered years by 2015 and (b) increase term limits for Council members and the Executive from two consecutive four-year terms to three consecutive four-year terms, consistent with term limits in effect for Auditor, Assessor-Treasurer and Sheriff.
