PUBLIC MEETING

Woodland Avenue Regional Stormwater Facility - Phase 2 “Pond Expansion and Recreational Enhancements”

Thursday, May 26, 2005, 4 to 7p.m.

You are invited to attend a public meeting about plans to expand as well as provide for recreational enhancements to the existing Woodland Avenue Regional Stormwater Facility. The meeting will be hosted by the Pierce County Public Works and Utilities, Water Programs staff and will include a brief presentation, followed by a discussion with local residents and other interested parties. People will have an opportunity to speak with staff one-on-one.

Project Summary:

The existing stormwater detention pond, located at the 11700 block of Woodland Ave East, was constructed in 2003 by Water Programs to reduce regional flooding problems (Phase 1). Phase 2 of this project, planned for the summer of 2005, will expand the existing pond to the south by 1.35 acres and incorporate public access and enhancements for passive recreational uses of the site. The concept of providing for recreational enhancements has not been tested by Pierce County Water Programs in the past and this project is considered to be a “Pilot Project” to evaluate the potential for similar projects in the future. As conceptually planned, the Woodland Avenue project will serve the primary purpose as a stormwater detention facility and a secondary purpose as a passive recreational area for the public.

Enhancements for the passive recreational area planned at this time include:

- ◆ 6-foot wide porous asphalt pedestrian trails
- ◆ Parking for approximately 26 vehicles, using porous asphalt and grass
- ◆ Garbage cans
- ◆ Portable toilets
- ◆ Dog waste disposal stations
- ◆ Planted grass and trees
- ◆ Decorative Fencing

Visitors to the site will be able to park their vehicles and walk the trails during the summer months when the pond is dry. During the winter the pond will serve its main purpose of preventing local floods with the filling of stormwater and the site will be closed to the public.
