Please join us at Pacific Lutheran University to help us move forward on issues involving the Chambers-Clover Watershed. This conference will conclude with a field trip, refreshments and ground breaking ceremony for the Pierce County Naches Trail Preserve.

Conference sessions include:

- Dick Muri, Pierce County Councilmember, will kick off the event with an introduction and welcome address.
- Dr. Kathy Troost, geological research scientist from the University of Washington, will discuss the geologic and glacial history of the watershed and its characteristics.
- Mark Savoca, project manager with the United States Geological Survey, will discuss the development of a ground-water model for the watershed and how it can be used to better manage water resources.
- Dr. Jeanne Jacoby, professor of civil and environmental engineering at Seattle University, will cover lake water quality, including toxic algae conditions.
